## **Committee Chair Reports:**

Finance: Councilor Irvin offered a motion to pay the bills in the amount of \$49,917.46. Councilor Kirkland duly seconded the motion. Highlights on the bills included Building Specialties Company in the amount of \$8,027.60 as well as Campbell's Paving, for new parking spaces at Bicentennial Park in the amount of \$5,000. Mayor Cochran called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. Mayor Cochran, "let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously."

Enhancements: Councilor Roberts offered a motion to approve the budget for City Fest in the amount of \$15,000 as well as approve the date for April 29, 2023. Councilor Kirkland duly seconded the motion. Mayor Cochran called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'.

Annexation: Councilor Churchwell offered an Ordinance for the annexation of 6955 Joy Circle, Pinson, AL 35126. Councilor Roberts duly seconded the motion. Councilor Walker offered a motion to provide a \$5,000 supplement for the Pinson Valley High School Band Director, Keith Brandenburg, and Basketball Coach Barbour. Councilor Walker mentioned that both of these men have done outstanding work. Councilor Kirkland duly seconded the motion. Mayor Cochran called for a roll call vote with the following results: Councilor Irvin- yes, Councilor Walker- yes, Councilor Roberts- yes, Councilor Churchwell- yes, Councilor Kirkland- yes, Mayor Cochran- yes. Mayor Cochran, "let the record reflect that passes unanimously."

Mayor Cochran suspended rules.

Hal Ferris, Building and Inspections Director, gave the yearly report on building and inspections. Hal Ferris announced that the revenue from inspections and permits was \$151,000 since the start of the department in October of 2021.

Chris Horn, Center Point Fire Department Captain, gave a report.

Mayor Cochran asked for a motion to adjourn.
