Committee Chair Reports:

<u>Finance:</u> Councilor Irvin offered a motion to approve the bills in the amount of \$96,102.51. Councilor Churchwell duly seconded the motion. Councilor Irvin highlighted the several Cleaning Service invoices that were lost in email and they are updated now. Mayor Pro Tem Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. Mayor Pro Tem Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously."

Old Business:

Mayor Pro Tem Roberts mentioned there is an opening to join the Library Board and to reach out to Mayor Pro Tem Roberts or to Allison Scanlan at the Pinson Public Library.

Councilor Walker offered a resolution to extend the contract with Waste Management for a 2 year extension. Councilor Irvin seconded the motion. Mayor Pro Tem Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. Mayor Pro Tem Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously."

Rules Suspended:

Eric Winfrey gave a report regarding the construction at the Rock School Auditorium, stating it should be completed by the end of March. He also talked about the Emergency HVAC Repair in the back area of the City Hall Building. To repair would have been \$8,000 and to replace will be \$13,000.
